> India Grain Legume Cluster Development: Policy, Production and Nutrition

It was the third year of this project with the objective of increasing production and productivity of pulses of farmers and connecting them to organised marketing system. Following activities conducted

 Establishment of demo plots in all three seasons of farmers who adopted Pulses farming. During this activity, all farmers who were the members of farmers interest groups were trained on improved packages of practices of all pulses and demo plots were established with the assistance of project personnel in the blocks of Nautan and Bairiya.

Training, and meeting of farmers and office bearers of farmers interest groups

During the project period, altogether 142 farmers interest groups with 2338 farmers as members were formed in 40 villages of Nautan and Bairiya blocks. Meetings of all farmers interest groups usually held once in every month in which improved packages of all pulses and modern tools for pulses were discussed. There is 03 office bearers in each group who have provided training on management of group.

Management of Community Solar Irrigation System

It is a very important challenge of reducing expenditure of cost in farming by farmers and trying our best to use tools for reduction in expenditure by providing equipment banks or community driven solar irrigation system to farmers groups. In this context, SSEVS has established 02 community driven solar irrigation systems in Maniyari Jhakhra village of Nautan block. These 02 systems caters 35 acres of land and 61 farmers with minimal cost of irrigation. There are 02 group which have been trained for management of irrigation groups and they are managing their groups well in their respective villages. In view of the model adopted by the farmers, another system was installed in Sirisia, Bairiya Block. The community also invested the 20% of the cost and provided land for establishment of solar irrigation system.

Management of Farmers Facilitation Centres

To connect the farmers with modern tools and techniques, for increasing the production and productivity, 05 farmers facilitation centres have been established in target area which caters 2000 farmers with latest small tools and zero tillage machines for improving their farming techniques. Some of the small tools were provided to these facilitation centres with an aim to reducing drudgery among women while working in the field. These centres are being operated and managed by farmers themselves.

To make all farmers in cluster based groups and connecting all farmers in FPC, a lot of activities like door to door campaign, Atmanirbhar Rath, movie show, farmers meeting were held in order to aware on the importance of farmers producer organisation for themselves.

 Training and Exposure visit of Board of directors of farmers' producer company.

It was observed that farmers of these areas are not getting enough market value of the yield, in spite of increasing production of pulses and other cereals. In view of this, one farmers producer company was facilitated by the organisation. It consists of has 10 board of directors 02 blocks. 01 exposure visits have been organised for board of directors to agricultural university and successful farmers producer organisation.

> Development of Marginalised Community to Sustain Their Livelihood

- This is the fifth year of the this project and aims to increase more livelihood options among dalit and marginalised communities in 10 hamlets of Jogapatti Block with the support of Bread for the World.

- There are following activities organised:
 - Training of communities/farmers on Agricultural based vegetable farming. 350 farmers from different dalit and marginalised communities have been trained and also assisted with on-job training. There are 19 families who are producing vermi-compost and subsidy from govt received. 48 families involve in vegetable farming on own/leased land for their livelihood of the families.
 - Awareness campaign among landless farmers and women for govt schemes for livelihood. There are altogether 3 camps organised in



which 475 farmers and women participated. The following schemes received or applied:

- Leadership training among landless families who are not having land for their residence. 543 landless families have applied for land for residence to govt office.
- Training to Boys and girls adolescents for becoming a good citizen. There are 04 adolescents group formed and managed by the project. There are 65 adolescents who are the active members of these groups. Training imparted on govt schemes, Child rights, Child marriage etc to them.
- Training and exposure of farmers on Vermi Compost for their livelihood. Landless farmers were provided training on establishment of vermi-compost pit and making organic manure. They were provided an exposure to one progressive farmers farm who was engaged in making vermi-compost for years.
- > Promotion of Sustainable Livelihood Platforms Among Dalit Community in Bihar for Socio-Economic Empowerment and Well-being

This project is being implemented with an aim to increase livelihood options of dalit and marginalised communities through vegetable cultivation and marketing.



Important activities and achievements

- Baseline Survey of target groups. All the families of the target villages were surveyed and focus group discussions held to observe the possibility of taking vegetable farming as their livelihood option.
- Monthly meetings of farmers groups. There are 12 farmers groups formed and being managed in 06 villages. These groups comprises 138 women and 129 men. Monthly meetings of the groups were held every month in which problems regarding CBOs, vegetable farming and remedial actions were discussed.
- Establishment of Demo plots of different vegetables, training of farmers group on improved package of practices. 60 demo plots were established in every seasons of different vegetables and different methodology with the active support of farmers. 06 field day were organised on different vegetable plots and feedback session held in which 128 farmers participated.
- Training and demonstration of organic pesticides/tonics and vermicompost. With an aim to reduce expenditure on vegetable cultivation and reducing carbon emission for Climate Change, 03 trainings were organised for making organic pesticides/tonics i.e. Brahmastra, Jiva Amrit and Vermicompost. 47 farmers in first season i.e. Rabi 2018 and 74 farmers in second season Jayad 2019 used these organic pesticide in their vegetable field.
- There were 128 farmers who participated in the o6 trainings. They are all using these pesticides in their vegetable field.
- Management of Farmers Facilitation Centres. To connect the farmers with modern tools and techniques, for increasing the production and productivity, o6 farmers facilitation centres have been established in target area which caters 250 farmers with latest small tools and zero tillage machines for improving their farming techniques. Some of the small tools were provided to these facilitation centres with an aim to reducing drudgery among women while working in the field. These centres are being operated and managed by farmers themselves. Mechanised sprayers, Grubber, Cycle hoe have been provided to each farmers facilitation centres. They were also trained by the scientist i.e. Dr. Reyaj Ahmad of Krishi Vigyan Kendra in which 52 dalit farmers were participated.

Internet Sathi

This project was Phia Foundation and FREND supported which catered 175500 adolescent girls and women for learning internet processes by 265 internet sathis in 16 blocks of Samastipur and Chhapra. The objective of the project was to aware ladies and adolescents on internet operations.



Digital Livelihood Profiling

- This project was also supported by Phia Foundation and FREND. The aim of the project was to collect data of all internet sathi who are willing to get connected with self-employment for themselves. The project area was 04 blocks of Samastipur and Saran districts.
- **ISSP Internet Safety and Security Program.** The project too was supported by PHIA and FREND and its activities were implemented 04 blocks of Samastipur and Saran districts. The objective of the training was to aware women and adolescents about precautions and security against cyber crime.


